Task on which assessment is made: Community Rugby Department

Hazard(s)/risk(s) identified:

1. Slips and trips- risk of personal injury associated with training and playing rugby
2. Tackles/Physical contact/contact with posts/ball- Risk of Bruising and/or broken limbs
3. Undisclosed Medical Condition- Adverse reaction to First Aid/potentially life threatening.
4. Extreme Weather conditions- Sunstroke/hypothermia/dehydration
5. No warm up- Strained muscles/ligaments
6. Jewellery- Risk of ripped piercing/ bruising
7. Boots/Studs- Risk of bruising/ Cuts
8. Eating Beforehand-Cramp
9. Overexertion- Breathing difficulty/dehydration
10. Condition of Pitch/ Training area- Risk of bruising/ cuts/broken limbs/strained muscles and ligaments.
11. Challenging Behaviour-Staff or Participants verbally or physically abused.
12. Specific Health condition- Dependant on Health Condition.

Person(s) considered to be at risk:

Staff, Players, Visitors, Spectators, participants



Risk rating prior to control measures:

3 x 3 = risk rating 9

Control measures:

General-All training staff shall be trained to the minimum standards as required by the RFU Level of Coaching. Any age groups shall be independently assessed at the time as to the level of game allowed.

Area used for training and playing shall be inspected by training staff before any event commences. Should any concerns be raised by the staff, the event will be cancelled pending review by Community Management

First Aid measures will be defined by Community Chiefs Management team and may be the responsibility of a third party or customer.

1. First aid trained coaches/officials present.
2. First aid trained coaches/officials present.
3. Each player to notify of medical condition in writing.
4. Each player to wear suitable clothing/ Fluids available.
5. Warm up before playing/training
6. Removal of all jewellery before play commences.
7. Check boots/studs before play commences
8. Fluids available.
9. Disclosure of medical condition/ removal from play.
10. Refusal to play/train if poor or bad pitch conditions.
11. Disciplinary measures including taken to one side and exclusion from programme.
12. Separate individual Risk Assessment to be carried out

Training required. If YES, describe: YES

All coaches shall be trained to a minimum of level recognised by the RFU Level of Coaching. First Aid requirements shall be clarified by the Community Chiefs Management.

Risk rating with control measures/safe systems of work in place:

2 x 2 = risk rating 4
