

Player Development Group (PDG)

As I'm sure many of you will be aware, there have been some changes to the pathway which have been Introduced in alignment with RFU guidelines. The changes will see the end of the Developing Player Program (DPP) and a Player Development Group (PDG) installed in its place. The rationale for these changes can be found on the Exeter Chiefs website - <u>PDG Programme</u> (exeterchiefs.co.uk).

Whilst these changes will come with its challenges, we are excited for the new format to take shape in our region.

Pre-season has seen both Exeter College and Truro College run extensive programs throughout the summer with a selected group of u18s attending the RFU Malvern Festival in August. The squad were tested in games against Yorkshire, Gloucester and Harlequins. All those involved did themselves and their junior clubs proud. With the ACE games starting on Wednesday 11th September this was valuable learning experiences for all those involved. Good luck to both Colleges in the ACE competition.

PDG Chiefs South season pre-view: Matty Birbeck (Chiefs South PDG Manager):- The PDG 2024-2025 is going to welcome some exciting changes to Cornwall. This year there will be a real emphasis on developing not only a more rounded player, but also the technical and tactical nuances of the game. Both U15s and U16s PDG have opportunities to excel across the season despite the introduction of trials and extensive groups (Central group and Chiefs South). The emphasis this year is on watching these players play rugby. The curriculum at U15s and U16s has changed in Cornwall to try and allow more opportunities to play the game in controlled environments. We have equal opportunities for all players to enter the PDG throughout the season. We still believe in having a fluid pathway system meaning players can come and go with performances. As the PDG lead for Cornwall, I am very excited to get started this year.

PDG Chiefs North season pre-view: Lee Western (Chiefs North PDG Manager):- We are currently sat in the nomination process of players to take part in our trials. The trials this year are multistage with a mixture of unit specific, game-based scenario and a full game. We can play a straight game this season as we are taking advantage of a PDG playing opportunity which is in the time frame of our trials.

The first unit trial is to take place in October and the game-based trials start in December. Players are nominated from either their club or school to attend the first unit-based trials and then selected players will be invited back to enter the second trial, this will follow through each stage until selection is made in December.

We have 6 new PDG coaches who will coach closely alongside the Academy this season.









Coach Education:

Exeter Chiefs Academy kicked off their coach education programme at Truro College on Tuesday 3rd September with staff delivering nuances of defence and defensive systems in our pathway. Matty Birbeck reported: "On Tuesday 3rd September 2024, there was an open coaching session which specialised in defence ran at Truro College by Matt Birbeck. The evening allowed 35 club and school coaches from around Cornwall and Devon the opportunity to come along and listen and watch what happens in the Cornwall PDG around defence. The session looked at the 3 main areas of defence; tackle tech, breakdown, system. Each section involved a classroombased approach to listen and ask questions about the key points within the section, along with an on-field example of various drills and games used by the PDG to coach the section. The PDG coaches would interact with the players and the coaches watching to help better the young athletes and help clarify anything required from the coaches watching. Feedback from the evening was brilliant and well received which was the main aim of the evening. Hopefully, in the near future, Cornwall PDG will plan on running further courses similar to the defence theme".
